Class News – 6th March 2026

This week, **Little Learners** have enjoyed exploring and talking about shapes. We have been busy experimenting with different colours also, mixing colours to make new ones! Little Learners have really enjoyed story and rhyme time this week, singing our favourite rhymes and learning new ones. Some of the children have even made their own songs to well known tunes. We have really enjoyed celebrating world book day! The children were confident in showing and talking about their favourite stories. We also created some fantastic world book day T-shirts! Great work Little Learners.

Our **Reception** children had a fantastic session on Tuesday at Outdoor learning. We noticed some signs of Spring, such as blossom, buds and catkins on the trees, as well as the beautiful daffodils starting to open. The children showed great teamwork and perseverance when building structures, bug homes and gathering logs and twigs for our log pile. There was also some delicious mud pies being created using daisies, grass and mud. We also enjoyed finding lots of woodlouse in the logs, as well as ants in the mud pit!



The **Year 1** children really enjoyed their traditional tales workshop. They acted out different scenes and created their own versions of the story.

What a lovely week **Year 2** have had! The highlight being World Book Day where they took part in a Great Fire of London workshop. In this, the children explored the timeline of the fire through role play and drama. They loved dressing up and getting into role!

This week, **Year 3** children have been learning about Ancient Greece. They used an atlas to identify neighbouring countries and oceans, helping them understand where Greece is located and what places are nearby. The children also explored the differences between modern-day England and Ancient Greece, discussing what life was like during that period. In addition, we looked at the historical timeline to understand when these events took place.

A busy week in **Year 4**! We enjoyed solving puzzles with the Puzzle Man on Tuesday, working together to solve the puzzles. On Thursday, we had great fun decorating our t-shirts for World Book Day! We had everything from Alice in Wonderland to Pokemon! In amongst all the fun, we have learnt how land is used in the Amazon Rainforest in geography.

This week we have had puzzle man! **Year 5** loved completing these geometric puzzles and showed some incredible perseverance along the way. Mr Ede was very impressed at their ability to apply skills learnt from previous puzzles to solve problems with increasing difficulty.

This week in **Year 6** has been an interesting week! We had a visitor on Tuesday from Mr Ede, a previous secondary maths teacher who brought in his homemade geometric problem solving puzzles. The children absolutely loved it and Mr Ede commented on how wonderful the children's manners, behaviour and perseverance were. We also had our world book day T-Shirt making today. There were many wonderful, well-considered designs!

Supporting Trips and Enrichment Activities at Norton

At Norton, we feel incredibly fortunate to be able to organise a wide range of trips, workshops and activities that enhance your children's learning. These experiences provide valuable knowledge, broaden horizons and create lasting memories during their time at our school.

In order to offer these opportunities, we do ask families for financial contributions. As these contributions are voluntary, we cannot demand payment. However, if we do not receive sufficient contributions to cover the cost of a trip or activity, we will unfortunately have no choice but to cancel it moving forward.

The cost of coaches, entrance fees, and external providers visiting school continues to rise. Regrettably, the school budget is not able to absorb these increasing costs. We are extremely grateful to our PTA for the support they provide; however, they are not able to fully fund every activity we organise. This is why parental contributions remain essential.

We are mindful of the financial pressures on families and carefully limit the number of trips and activities across the year to avoid frequent requests for contributions. Our aim is always to provide enriching experiences without placing unnecessary burden on parents. However, we would much rather continue offering these opportunities than cancel them altogether.

For example, for the Diwali workshops that took place in November, we received only 56% of the total. This meant the school had to cover the remaining £613.50.

All trips and activities are available on ParentPay, and if you are in a position to do so, you are still able to contribute towards any events that have taken place earlier this academic year. We can accept cash, cheques or you can pay through the parentpay app or at a parentpay paypoint (if you would like details of a paypoint please ask the office)

We are truly grateful for your continued support in helping us provide these valuable experiences for your children. Without sufficient contributions, we will regrettably need to begin cancelling future trips and activities. If you are unable to pay for a trip/activity please call Mrs Farren as we are here to support you.
