Class News – 16th January 2026

This week in **Little Learners** we dived into the world of sea animals! We have shared many different stories linked to our theme of exploring sea animals. The children have enjoyed listening to "The Rainbow Fish" and "Hooray for fish" We used these stories to inspire our own creativity as we made our own fish using different tools and materials! We have also had lots of fun singing number rhymes and action rhymes. Little learners also enjoyed creating large splats with pom-poms and paint as part of our listening and attention activity this week.

Reception class had our first Outdoor Learning afternoon on Tuesday and well the weather wasn't on our side, but that didn't stop us having fun and exploring. The afternoon was filled with mud pie making, bug hunting, malleating poles into the ground, digging and lots of communication and negotiation skills! Fantastic! We look forward to next Tuesday!



In Computing this week the **Year 1** children were learning about how to make different marks using the app 'Paint' on the Ipad. They seemed to really enjoy discovering how to use it and worked well to attempt to solve any difficulties they came across.

In **Year 2** this week we have been immersing ourselves in our new class book 'The Night Gardener'. We have been looking at objects from the story and predicting what the story might be about. We have looked at the story setting and took part in role play using some of the characters. In Art we have been learning about the artist 'Paul Klee' and looked at some of his work.

This week in **Year 3**, we learned about the tragic Tōhoku earthquake that struck Japan in 2011. We explored why earthquakes are dangerous and used our creativity to design posters to warn people about the risks of this natural disaster. We also spent an afternoon taking part in Look Who's Talking. Every speech was fantastic, and it was wonderful to see so many children confidently volunteering to take part - we had 18 in year 3!

Some of us attended Young Voices yesterday and what a fantastic time we had! The children were super and loved singing along to the songs. They represented Norton very well.

Year 4 have also been looking at our example text in English this week ready to start planning our twisted narrative stories. In geography we learnt about the different world biomes.

This week **Year 5** have learnt how to multiply a unit fraction by an integer. I have been incredibly impressed with their accuracy and their use of mathematical vocabulary when explaining their understanding. Our next lesson will be multiplying a non-unit fraction by an integer.

This week **Year 6** started algebra in maths. The children have taken to it superbly and are doing a fantastic job. We also looked at the different symbols on an OS map and used local maps to help consolidate our learning.

2026 car safety resolutions:

As we start the new year, we'd like to encourage everyone to be conscious of their parking and help keep our school community safe:

- Please switch off your engine while parked in the car park. Vehicle fumes can be harmful, especially for children with asthma or other respiratory conditions.
- Drive at a sensible speed within the car park and remain mindful of other drivers and pedestrians at all times.

Thomas handled himself really well. We are very proud of him.

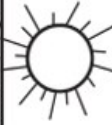
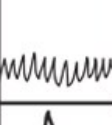
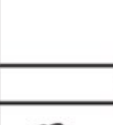
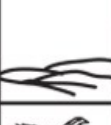
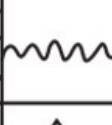
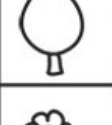
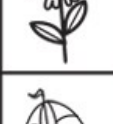
