A message from Mrs Farren...

Happy 2026! It is, as ever, a joy to be back with your wonderful children. As the cold weather kicks in, please ensure that your child has warm outdoor clothing and that these are ALL labelled with their name. Thank you.

Taking part in the look who's talking competition.

Time to Get Talking in 2026 - The school finals are next Friday, 16th January. Class heats are Thursday 15th January. Our school is very excited to be taking part in the 'Look Who's Talking!' competition, along with lots of other schools in Gloucestershire!

What is oracy and why is it so important?

Oracy is the ability to express ourselves clearly and communicate with others effectively, through spoken language. By teaching our children to become more effective speakers and listeners, we are all helping to give them the tools they need to better understand themselves, each other and the world around them.

How will the competition work?

Your child will get the chance to talk to their class for two minutes, about any subject that they choose and then a 'Star Speaker' will be chosen. Star Speakers from every class will then get to talk in front of the whole school. Those winners will then go on to the next stage and will represent our school in the competition, with lots of other local schools! The grand final will be on 04.04.26

What can your child talk about?

Children can talk about absolutely anything that they choose to, for up to two-minutes. They can use any props that they wish to, which will help with their talk, but just cannot use any technology, so no Powerpoint slide shows please.

How can you help them at home?

First of all, please help them to think about what they would like to talk about. The more interested they are in the subject, the more passionate their talk will be!

What are they interested in? What excites them? It might be a toy, their pet, a book, something they have seen on TV, their favourite sports team, something they have learned about from you at home - or anything else! It really can be anything at all!

They will need to plan and rehearse their speech, so please listen to them practice and give them lots of encouragement! Make sure they are speaking with big voices, nice and clearly, so everyone can hear their talk and learn about their chosen topic.

Class News – 9th January 2026

Welcome back to a new term! **Little Learners** have had 'snow' much fun as we explored our small dusting of snow earlier this week. The children made snow angels and snow balls! We also explored some ice that had frozen over night in our builders tray! This term we are learning about 'Animals all around us'. We introduced our new topic this week by exploring animals that live on the farm! We have enjoyed exploring farm themed small world play, joining in with songs and sharing stories. We also enjoyed taking part in our communication and interaction activity; Dancing raisins! The children were confident in talking about what they could see and were able to share their ideas of what might happen next!

WOW! What a great week back in **Reception** Class. This week we have been learning about frogs, as in our English work we will be writing an information page about frogs to persuade the character Dan's Dad like frogs! We have been very impressed with their enthusiasm to learn new facts and with the application of phonics skills when writing short captions.



It's been great to be back at school with the **Year 1** children and what a fun week it's been! We started our week off with a walk around the field, it was lovely to catch up about what we all did during the holidays.

A great first week back in **Year 2**! We have written our Bog Baby stories and enjoyed sharing these with each other. In maths we have learnt how to add three single digit numbers using efficient methods. In My Happy Mind we have learnt how to appreciate each other, our families and friends.

Year 3 have been busy building their instruction writing skills! We each wrote our own step-by-step guide on how to make a jam sandwich, then put them to the test by following the instructions together as a class. It was lots of fun (and a little messy!) and showed us just how important it is to be clear and specific. This hands-on activity will really help us with our end of topic writing.

In **Year 4** this week we have started learning about multiplying and dividing numbers by 10 and 100. We have used place value grids to support us with this understanding as well as using this knowledge to solve missing number problems. In science we have started our new unit of living things and sorted different living things into categories.

This week **Year 5** have enjoyed starting a new topic of invasion games in PE - they started with hockey and mastering how to change direction as quickly as possible, the children worked brilliantly and were very enthusiastic from the start!

Happy new year all! **Year 6** have gotten straight back into the swing of things this week. We are learning how to write an award speech for a brave person in English at the moment, with specific focus on formal vocabulary. In maths we have finished looking at ratio and will soon be moving on to algebra.

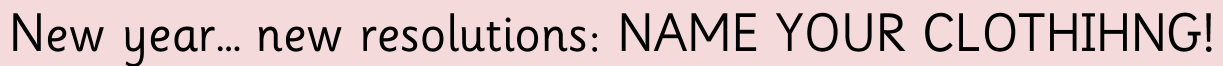

Pupil Health and Safety Information

2026 car safety resolutions:

As we start the new year, we'd like to encourage everyone to be conscious of their parking and help keep our school community safe:

- Please use one parking space per car and ensure you park fully within the marked bays. Parking outside designated spaces makes it difficult for other drivers to maneuver and can be hazardous for our children. One space is all that's needed for each vehicle.
- Disabled parking bays are reserved for current Blue Badge holders only.
- At no time should vehicles stop on the zig-zag lines outside the school. This poses a serious health and safety risk for pedestrians using the front entrance and for road users travelling to and from the A38, particularly as this is on a bend.
- Please switch off your engine while parked in the car park. Vehicle fumes can be harmful, especially for children with asthma or other respiratory conditions.
- Drive at a sensible speed within the car park and remain mindful of other drivers and pedestrians at all times.
- ALWAYS use seatbelts!

Healthy recipe of the week!



A chocolate bark alternative...

Hands up if you've eaten too much chocolate over the Christmas holidays? Why not swap the chocolate for this healthy snack instead? Inspired by chocolate bark, this uses yoghurt instead for a fun but much healthier alternative!



Ingredients

500g/1lb 2oz yoghurt, low-fat Greek, coconut, soya or thick kefir

For the berry and pistachio topping

150g/5½oz frozen mixed berries

30g/1oz pistachios, roughly chopped

1 tbsp honey or maple syrup

For the date and orange topping

100g/3½oz chopped pitted dates

25g/1oz almonds, roughly chopped

1 orange, finely grated zest only

For the fig and raspberry topping

3 figs, roughly chopped

150g/5½oz raspberries

pinch ground cinnamon

Method

1. Line a large baking tray with greaseproof paper and spread the yoghurt over the paper in an even layer.
2. Add your chosen toppings, distributing them evenly over the yoghurt. Freeze for 2 hours or until solid.
3. Carefully peel away the paper, then break the yoghurt into shards and place in a freezer bag. Seal and keep frozen for up to 3 months.
