Class News – 19th June 2026

This week in **Little Learners** we have enjoyed exploring different types of print. We followed a recipe to make a delicious treat that we shared during an afternoon snack! We have also taken part in Dough Disco this week, using playdough and a range of specific finger/hand movements along to music to strengthen our fine motor skills in preparation for pencil control and writing. Of course, the song just had to be; Golden, a Little Learners favourite! We also welcomed important male role models for our little learners to bring to our stay and play session on Thursday. We understand that work and life commitments can be tricky to juggle, so thank you for taking the time to join us. If you were unable to attend this stay and play session, we do have another opportunity for you to come and celebrate your Little Learners success this year! We are inviting all parents to attend our; End of year celebration on Wednesday 8th July 2.00pm-3.00pm.

This week in Maths **Year 1** have been partitioning numbers between 50 and 100. We were really impressed with the children's ability to see how many tens and ones each number are made up of. They also did well at spotting mistakes on the board and explaining their answers in depth.

This week in **Year 3**, we have been reading Dear Ocean, which links to our Geography topic on oceans. The children have practised different types of writing, including postcards, diary entries and posters, focusing on how human actions such as littering and cutting down trees affect habitats. We have also planned persuasive environmental letters based on either the jungle or the ocean, encouraging people to take care of our planet.

This week, within French, **Year 5** have looked at activities that can be done at the beach. We studied the French sentences, read them out loud and made vocabulary links to prior learning to find out what they meant.

This week in Geography **Reception** were exploring Norton and Gloucester on Google maps and then noticing similarities and differences. They could not believe how much greener Norton was in comparison to Gloucester! We then sorted pictures of landscapes and features into home and away. We had lots of discussions about where we would like to visit and why.

Reception class trip payment and Multiskills payment are now on parentpay.

In **Year 2** this week we have been writing messages of positivity to the main character in our new class text- Rosie Revere. We have made cards for Rosie and have written words of support and encouragement in them. In Science we have been learning about how animals survive extreme climates by adapting to the habitat they live in. Our PE lesson involved us learning a new game- Beanbag Rounders. We had so much fun and Mr Spencer said how great we were playing it!

In **Year 4** this week we had a brilliant day at Corinium Museum in Cirencester. We saw lots of Roman artefacts and walked to the amphitheatre before having a workshop that taught us all about life as a Roman. In



science, we learnt about components we need to make a circuit before using a battery and wires to make the lightbulb light up.

This week, in **Year 6**, we have continued with our play rehearsals. It is coming along very well! We have also been exploring the book "a story like the wind" ready for some narrative writing as well as looking at the kingdoms of the Anglo-Saxons in History.

Due to prior bookings in the hall schedule, we have been allocated an earlier performance slot this year, and we are very grateful for your flexibility and support. The dress rehearsal will take place for the rest of the school during the week before, so please ensure that all costumes are in school by Monday 29th June.

Norton PTA have kindly arranged for the Wednesday performance to be professionally filmed. To help ensure the best possible recording and minimise distractions during filming, we would respectfully ask that families with very young children attend the Thursday performance where possible. A video link of the production will be available to purchase for £5. 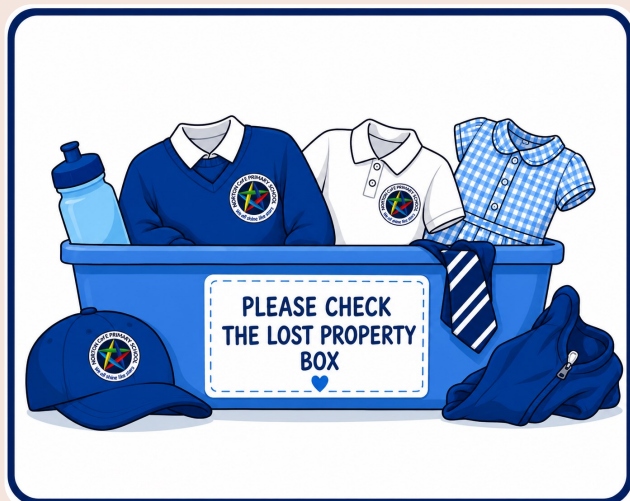

Supporting Trips and Enrichment Activities at Norton

At Norton, we feel incredibly fortunate to be able to organise a wide range of trips, workshops and activities that enhance your children's learning. These experiences provide valuable knowledge, broaden horizons and create lasting memories during their time at our school.

In order to offer these opportunities, we do ask families for financial contributions. As these contributions are voluntary, we cannot demand payment. However, if we do not receive sufficient contributions to cover the cost of a trip or activity, we will unfortunately have no choice but to cancel it moving forward.

The cost of coaches, entrance fees, and external providers visiting school continues to rise. Regrettably, the school budget is not able to absorb these increasing costs. We are extremely grateful to our PTA for the support they provide; however, they are not able to fully fund every activity we organise. This is why parental contributions remain essential.

We are mindful of the financial pressures on families and carefully limit the number of trips and activities across the year to avoid frequent requests for contributions. Our aim is always to provide enriching experiences without placing unnecessary burden on parents. However, we would much rather continue offering these opportunities than cancel them altogether.

For example, for the Diwali workshops that took place in November, we received only 56% of the total. This meant the school had to cover the remaining £613.50.

All trips and activities are available on ParentPay, and if you are in a position to do so, you are still able to contribute towards any events that have taken place earlier this academic year. We can accept cash, cheques or you can pay through the parentpay app or at a parentpay paypoint (if you would like details of a paypoint please ask the office)

We are truly grateful for your continued support in helping us provide these valuable experiences for your children. Without sufficient contributions, we will regrettably need to begin cancelling future trips and activities. If you are unable to pay for a trip/activity please call Mrs Farren as we are here to support you.

On Thursday 2nd July 2026, Reception will be visiting Cotswold Wildlife Park for an exciting school trip. Healthy recipe of the week..



Three bears breakfast recipe

Adding fruit to porridge really livens it up – and contributes to your 5 A Day.

Prep: 5 mins
Cook: 8 mins
Serves 4

Ingredients

- 200g high-fibre porridge oats
- 1 litre 1%-fat milk
- 80ml cold water
- 4 tablespoons low-fat natural yoghurt
- 1 apple, cored and thinly sliced
- 40g frozen raspberries, thawed (fresh are also fine)



Method

1. Put the porridge oats into a saucepan with the milk and water. Heat, stirring constantly, until the porridge thickens. Reduce the heat and simmer for 3 to 4 minutes, still stirring.

If you or the kids cannot have dairy, make the porridge with water, or an alternative milk like soy or oat.

2. Share the porridge between 4 serving bowls and top with the yoghurt, apple and raspberries. Serve immediately.

Try topping with ready-prepared mango and fresh pineapple – available in most supermarkets. You could also use canned fruit, packed in natural juice.

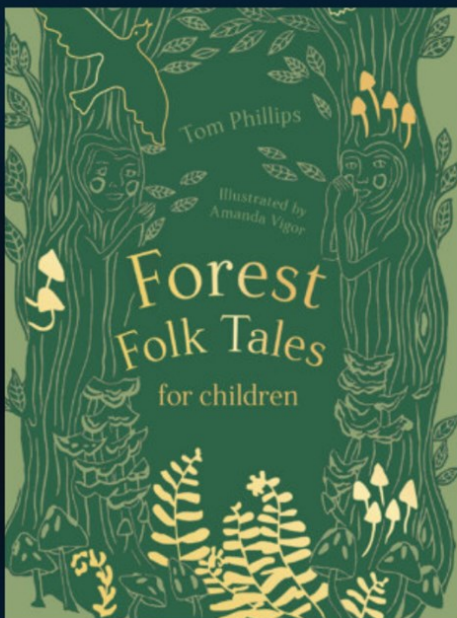
