Thank you for supporting us with our children in need pyjama wearing day today. Class News – 7th November 2025

This week in **Little Learners** we have been learning about the importance of Poppies as we explored remembrance day; making playdough poppies and painting our own poppies using a variety of tools to print with. We have also been exploring the different meanings of print, and have enjoyed playing a Logo game. For 'My Happy Mind' this week, little learners have enjoyed the experience of making their very own 'calm bottles'. We also enjoyed making bird feeders this week with some of the Y6 children. We talked about the importance of caring for nature, and looking after our world.

Little learners will not be taking part in the open afternoon on Friday 21st November, and will instead be offering a Christmas themed stay and play at a later date.

We will be sending home interim reports on Monday 17th November. Although we will not be offering parents evening appointments, we do welcome parents to come and see us if they would like to talk about their child's report.

This week, **Reception** have been busy learning to use our Sentence Snake to help us count words and build full sentences. The children have been working hard to write CVC words and captions linked to our story "The Something." We are so impressed with their growing confidence and their wonderful application of phonics in their writing. Well done, Reception!

In **Year 2** this week we have been immersing ourselves in our new class story 'Bog Baby'. We have explored the story setting and wrote a poem describing the main character. In maths we have used the inequality symbols $<$, $>$ and $=$ to compare numbers.



This term in Science, the **Year 1** children have been learning about all of the different senses. We had lots of fun on Tuesday afternoon smelling and tasting different foods. After doing this they were able to write down what items were their favourite/least favourite.



As expected, the sweet taste of biscuits went down well in comparison to the lemon! Similarly, vanilla was much more popular to smell than Worcester sauce and vinegar!!

Year 3 have been working extremely hard in their clarinets lesson this week in preparation for our show. We have also started looking at our new topic in Geography all about Japan, the children are excited to learn more about this.

In **Year 4** this week we have started our new unit in English using the text, Arthur and the Golden Rope. We are enjoying the story and will be writing our own myth narrative! In DT, we tried different fruits in preparation for designing, creating and evaluating our own cold drinks. We created a questionnaire to see what our peers wanted in their cold drinks.
