Class News – 5th June 2026

This week in **Little Learners** we have introduced our new topic; Time to fly! This term we will be learning all about different types of transport and beginning to talk about transitioning to school. We have enjoyed learning and singing transport rhymes. Our favourite this week was "Zoom, Zoom, Zoom we're going to the moon". The children shared interesting facts about rockets, astronauts and space! Next week we will have a 'Space' themed week linking to the children's interests. Thank you for supporting and attending our sports day session, we had so much fun!

Reception children showed brilliant effort and enthusiastic participation during Sports Day. Everyone had lots of fun taking part in the different activities and races, demonstrating excellent teamwork, determination, and sportsmanship throughout the event. Well done to all the children for making it such a memorable morning!

Year 1's art creations that were inspired by Michael Basquiat are now proudly on display in the Infant corridor, (quickly becoming our art gallery!) please feel free to come and have a look. This week, the children have used string to create a print pad, that they will paint in their next lesson and use for printing... all great fun whilst learning lots of new techniques!

Year 2 have worked with a partner to design an island in preparation for their Design and Technology project. They all enjoyed a fantastic Sports Day where they showed skill, accuracy and great resilience as well as having lots of fun!

In RE and worldviews this week, **Year 3** have started a new topic focusing on 'the golden rule' - we looked at artwork from children that depicted this and voted twice; first on our favourite based on just looks, and then again once we'd read the descriptions on how the artist had linked their art to the golden rule. The results were very different, which we all found very interesting!

Year 4 have enjoyed reading our new story in English, 'Manfish'. We have written a setting description about the ocean setting. In History we learnt about everyday life In Ancient Rome and wrote a guide about this.

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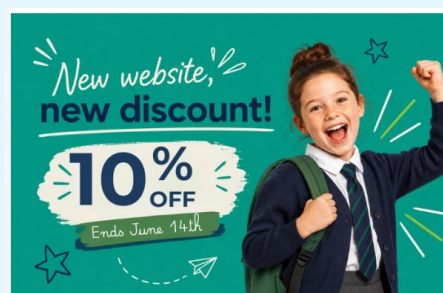
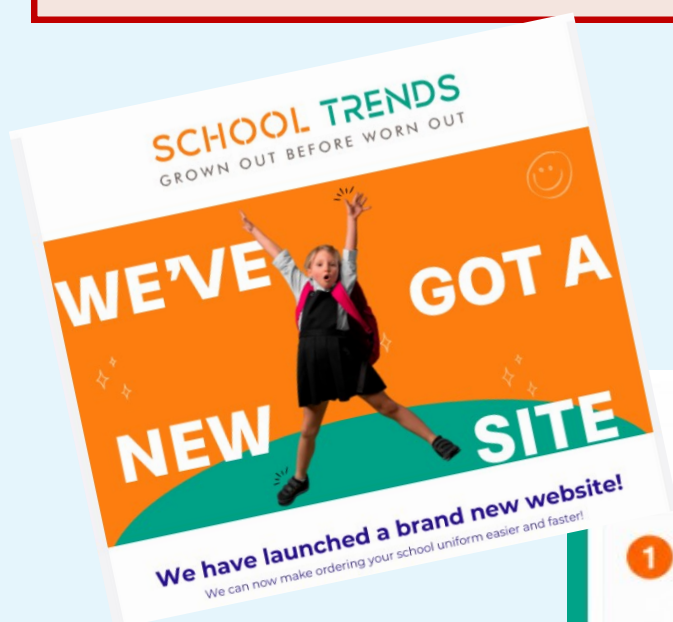

TRIPS AND ACTIVITIES

Supporting Trips and Enrichment Activities at Norton

At Norton, we feel incredibly fortunate to be able to organise a wide range of trips, workshops and activities that enhance your children's learning. These experiences provide valuable knowledge, broaden horizons and create lasting memories during their time at our school.

In order to offer these opportunities, we do ask families for financial contributions. As these contributions are voluntary, we cannot demand payment. However, if we do not receive sufficient contributions to cover the cost of a trip or activity, we will unfortunately have no choice but to cancel it moving forward.

The cost of coaches, entrance fees, and external providers visiting school continues to rise. Regrettably, the school budget is not able to absorb these increasing costs. We are extremely grateful to our PTA for the support they provide; however, they are not able to fully fund every activity we organise. This is why parental contributions remain essential.

We are mindful of the financial pressures on families and carefully limit the number of trips and activities across the year to avoid frequent requests for contributions. Our aim is always to provide enriching experiences without placing unnecessary burden on parents. However, we would much rather continue offering these opportunities than cancel them altogether.

For example, for the Diwali workshops that took place in November, we received only 56% of the total. This meant the school had to cover the remaining £613.50.

All trips and activities are available on ParentPay, and if you are in a position to do so, you are still able to contribute towards any events that have taken place earlier this academic year. We can accept cash, cheques or you can pay through the parentpay app or at a parentpay paypoint (if you would like details of a paypoint please ask the office)

We are truly grateful for your continued support in helping us provide these valuable experiences for your children. Without sufficient contributions, we will regrettably need to begin cancelling future trips and activities. If you are unable to pay for a trip/activity please call Mrs Farren as we are here to support you.

Re: Corinium Museum Cirencester

On Tuesday 16th June 2026, Year 4 have an exciting trip to the Corinium Museum in Cirencester. We will explore the museum galleries as well as take part in an active workshop. Children will learn about everyday Roman life through a series of activities. They will get hands-on with mosaic making, Roman games, food and pottery and Roman clothing. This workshop brings Roman Britain to life in a practical way for the children. In the museum galleries, children will get the opportunity to explore and find a variety of Roman artefacts that link to the workshop. We will also be taking a walk to the Roman Amphitheatre in Cirencester.

We will leave school at 9.15am and return by home time at 3:15pm. Children will need a packed lunch, water bottle, suitable footwear and coat depending on the weather (we will be spending time outside for some of the day).

The cost of this trip is £19 per pupil. Although this is a voluntary contribution, we rely on parental payments to cover the full cost of the visit. Unfortunately, if we do not receive sufficient contributions, we may have to cancel the trip. This year the school has not been receiving sufficient funds to pay for trips.

Payment is now available on ParentPay and can be made via the app; alternatively, cash or cheques can be sent to the school office in a clearly named envelope. Please contact Mrs Farren know if you are unable to contribute to this trip, as we are here to support you.

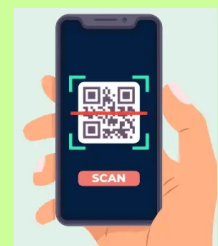
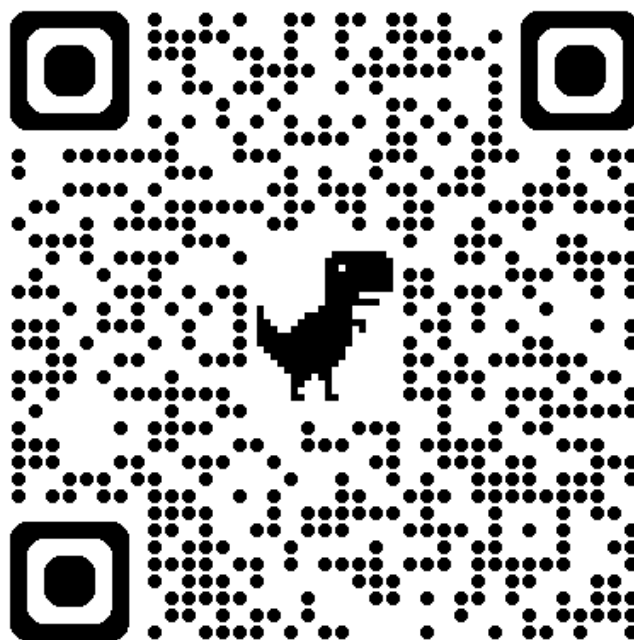

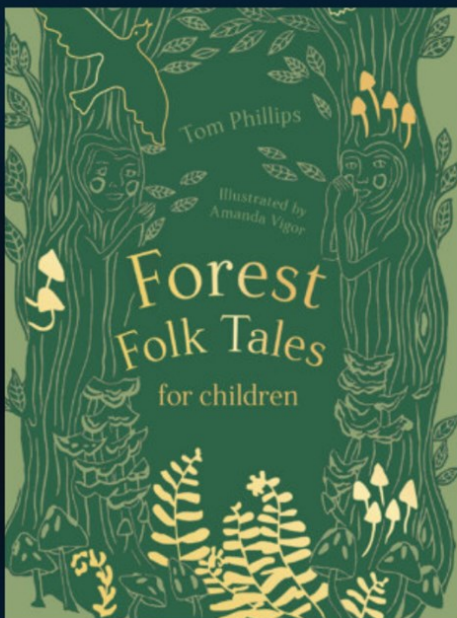
