Class News – 22nd May 2026

Little Learners have been very busy this week learning all about germs! We learnt how hand washing with soap helps to keep us healthy and stay well. We saw this in action as we conducted a germ experiment using water, mixed herbs and hand soap. This was a lovely visual to show how germs really don't like soap/hand wash. We have also enjoyed lots of sensory play this week; exploring glittery bubbly water, making play dough and threading pasta. Little learners have also enjoyed exploring our new mark making station where they can use a variety of mark making tools independently. This has been a very popular area within our classroom this week!

This week in **Reception**, we have focused on correct letter formation and developing a good pencil grip. The children have made great progress and worked incredibly hard throughout all of our activities. We are especially proud of the resilience and perseverance they have shown when faced with mistakes, demonstrating a positive attitude towards learning and a willingness to keep trying. Well done Reception!

In English this term **Year 1**'s writing has been focused around the text 'The Secret of Black Rock'. The children planned their narratives and then wrote them up in full. We were blown away by the childrens stories, their use of punctuation and spelling. They are all making fantastic progress!

In **Year 2** this week we have been talking about how to be a good friend and enjoyed taking part in role play scenarios. In Geography we have looked at the physical and human features of Coll.



This week, the **Year 3** children had an amazing time on their school trip to the Cotswold Farm Park. We discovered lots of interesting facts about the different animals and even



got the chance to feed the goats, stroke the bunnies and hold baby chicks. The cheeky goats even decided to make a great escape at one point, causing lots of laughter before they were safely rounded up again by Mrs Murphy!

Year 4 have had a brilliant week! We have written our own narrative stories in English and I am really proud of how focussed everyone has been; really thinking about their content and presentation. Maths this week has required some perseverance with converting between hours, seconds, minutes, weeks, days and months. We really had to think about the calculations we'd use for each conversion. In History, we learnt about Roman towns and designed our own towns.

Your 'Reading River' should look like a river flowing across your page, showing the journey of your reading from the start of the holiday to the end. Along the river, add the different things you have read. You can write about them, draw pictures, add labels, or even stick on images if you like.

Remember, reading is not just books! You can include things such as:

- Story books or non-fiction books
- Newspapers or magazines
- Road signs or maps
- Cereal boxes or food packaging
- Menus from restaurants or takeaways
- Instructions or manuals
- Online reading, gaming menus or social media
- E-books or audio books

Next to each thing you add to your river, you might also include:

- Where you read it
- What you learned from it
- A small drawing or picture

You could even add a smiley face rating to show how you felt about reading it:

- **Green** = I loved reading this!
- **Amber** = It was okay or a little challenging
- **Red** = I didn't enjoy it or found it challenging

Be as creative and colourful as you like! Add waves, bridges, boats, fish, trees or anything else that makes your river interesting. Please see the examples on the next page for inspiration!

Supporting Trips and Enrichment Activities at Norton

At Norton, we feel incredibly fortunate to be able to organise a wide range of trips, workshops and activities that enhance your children's learning. These experiences provide valuable knowledge, broaden horizons and create lasting memories during their time at our school.

In order to offer these opportunities, we do ask families for financial contributions. As these contributions are voluntary, we cannot demand payment. However, if we do not receive sufficient contributions to cover the cost of a trip or activity, we will unfortunately have no choice but to cancel it moving forward.

The cost of coaches, entrance fees, and external providers visiting school continues to rise. Regrettably, the school budget is not able to absorb these increasing costs. We are extremely grateful to our PTA for the support they provide; however, they are not able to fully fund every activity we organise. This is why parental contributions remain essential.

We are mindful of the financial pressures on families and carefully limit the number of trips and activities across the year to avoid frequent requests for contributions. Our aim is always to provide enriching experiences without placing unnecessary burden on parents. However, we would much rather continue offering these opportunities than cancel them altogether.

For example, for the Diwali workshops that took place in November, we received only 56% of the total. This meant the school had to cover the remaining £613.50.

All trips and activities are available on ParentPay, and if you are in a position to do so, you are still able to contribute towards any events that have taken place earlier this academic year. We can accept cash, cheques or you can pay through the parentpay app or at a parentpay paypoint (if you would like details of a paypoint please ask the office)

We are truly grateful for your continued support in helping us provide these valuable experiences for your children. Without sufficient contributions, we will regrettably need to begin cancelling future trips and activities. If you are unable to pay for a trip/activity please call Mrs Farren as we are here to support you.

Re: Corinium Museum Cirencester

On Tuesday 16th June 2026, Year 4 have an exciting trip to the Corinium Museum in Cirencester. We will explore the museum galleries as well as take part in an active workshop. Children will learn about everyday Roman life through a series of activities. They will get hands-on with mosaic making, Roman games, food and pottery and Roman clothing. This workshop brings Roman Britain to life in a practical way for the children. In the museum galleries, children will get the opportunity to explore and find a variety of Roman artefacts that link to the workshop. We will also be taking a walk to the Roman Amphitheatre in Cirencester.

We will leave school at 9.15am and return by home time at 3:15pm. Children will need a packed lunch, water bottle, suitable footwear and coat depending on the weather (we will be spending time outside for some of the day).

The cost of this trip is £19 per pupil. Although this is a voluntary contribution, we rely on parental payments to cover the full cost of the visit. Unfortunately, if we do not receive sufficient contributions, we may have to cancel the trip. This year the school has not been receiving sufficient funds to pay for trips.

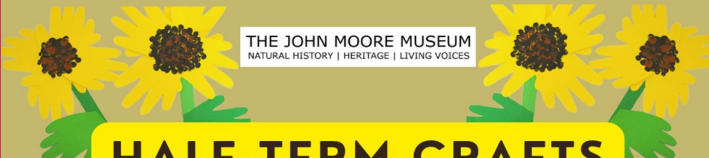

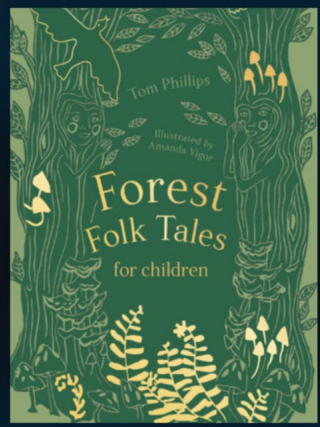

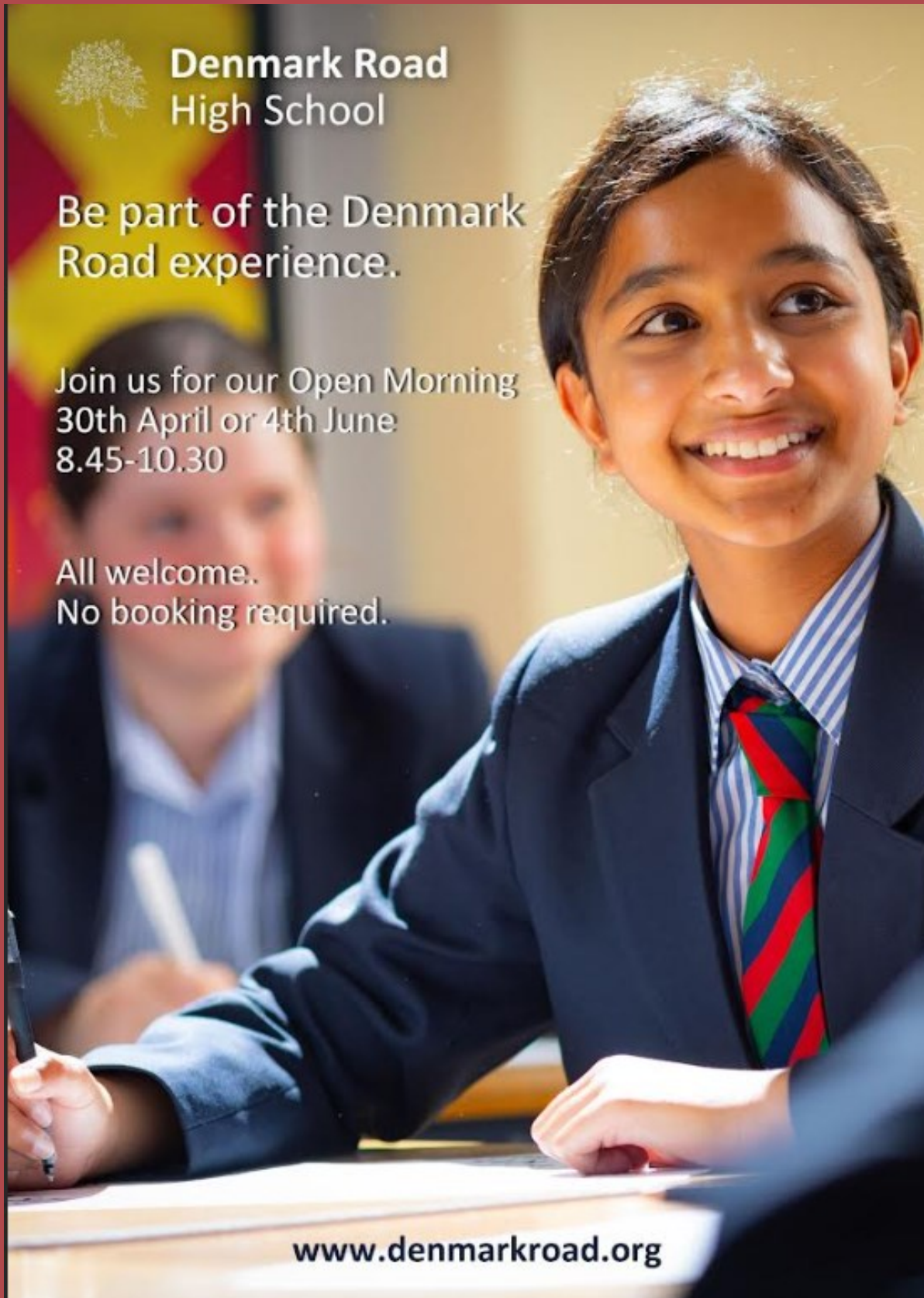
