A message from Mrs Farren...

More than ever, our lives are 'reliant' on screens and technology. We cannot dispute that these have a place in our fast changing, modern world. However, if we give our children phones too early or allow them to spend too much time on screens, we are harming their development. 21 Norton parents attended the online safety talk before half term. We are keen for important key messages to reach all families because keeping our children safe and allowing them to flourish is crucial.

Just before assembly next week (14th November, 2.15pm in the village hall) a Norton governor will be available to chat to parents about smartphone free childhood. Please pop in at this slightly earlier time if you are able.

Smartphone Free Childhood is a movement of families standing together to delay smartphones and social media – turning isolation into collective strength.

Together we're giving children back what truly matters: time to play, space to grow, freedom to be.

Because childhood should be shaped by families and communities, not algorithms.

There will be no sharing assembly on Friday 28th November. A specialist police officer will be giving an online safety talk for parents. Please attend this if you can (even if you attended the presentation I gave before half term). The specialist police officer will be giving a more detailed update on how to keep our children safe online.

Class News – 7th November 2025

This week in **Little Learners** we have been very busy exploring a variety of expressive art activities as we investigated a variety of tools and materials to create firework pictures! We have also been learning about calming breathing techniques with 'My happy minds', and talking about our emotions, linking this to the Colour monster. We created our very own feelings monsters! We have also been busy engaging with phonics activities, which have all been based around musical instruments!

Little learners will not be taking part in the open afternoon on Friday 21st November, and will instead be offering a Christmas themed stay and play at a later date.

We will be sending home interim reports on Monday 17th November. Although we will not be offering parents evening appointments, we do welcome parents to come and see us if they would like to talk about their child's report.

This week **Year 1** have started their new unit in PE of net and wall games. The children focused on the different parts of the tennis racket and learnt the ready position. They did very well at this, showing skill, knowledge and resilience. In the final part of the tennis lesson they worked on bouncing the ball with control. We all compared this to flipping pancakes, which the children found hilarious.

It has been a wonderful week having **Year 3** back in school. The children thoroughly enjoyed learning about the different types of rocks by using a magnifying glass to identify their features up close. We have also started a new topic in English. Without reading or seeing the front cover we made a prediction by unpicking vocabulary and the illustrations. Year 3 look forward to finding out more about the book and seeing if their predictions were correct.

This week, **Year 5** have looked into the Anglo-Saxons. We looked at where they originated from and how they made their way into what we now call England. We discussed why they decided to travel across the North Sea and why they then decided to stay.

Please can all children bring pyjamas with them to swimming on Wednesday. These will be worn over their normal swimming costumes.

This week, **Reception** have been learning all about Bonfire Night and the colourful celebrations that light up the sky! The children loved talking about their own experiences of fireworks and sharing how they celebrate with their families. We explored the bright colours of fireworks through art, using toilet rolls to print bursts of colour onto black paper — just like the night sky! To make them sparkle, we added plenty of glitter for that extra festive shine.

In **Year 2** this week we have been comparing numbers and recognising what to do when the number of tens are the same and when they are different. We have finished our Pointillism paintings and they are now going to be displayed in the infant cloakroom. You will see these when you come to Parent's Eve. They look wonderful!

In **Year 4** this week we have been writing our information reports all about polar bears. We have started to learn about area in our maths lessons, making shapes and comparing area. In science, we have investigated vibrations in different objects and how each sound is made.

This week in **Year 6** we have started looking at electricity in Science and how to draw precise, scientific diagrams. We compared modern day houses to those of ancient Baghdad in History. We have also been collecting ideas for writing a warning letter in English, with specific focus on formality and the use of the dash.

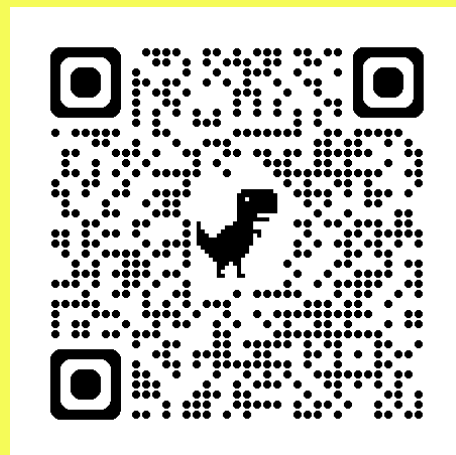

Healthy recipe of the week!

Pizza pinwheels

These pizza puff pinwheels make the ideal supper treat for under 5s, with ready-made pasta sauce, a little ham, grated cheese and shop-bought puff pastry

Ingredients

375g pack ready-rolled puff pastry
thawed if frozen

6 tbsp [ready-made pasta sauce](#)
(not too chunky)

100g wafer thin ham

100g [mature cheddar](#)
grated

1 [egg](#)
beaten

1 tsp [dried oregano](#)
or mixed herbs

Method

Step 1

Preheat oven to 200C/180C fan/gas 6. Unroll the pastry onto a lightly floured surface and roll it out to 40 x 32cm. Spread a layer of pasta sauce over it, leaving a 1cm border around the edges. Arrange the ham evenly on top, then scatter the grated cheese over.

Step 2

Starting at one of the short ends, roll the pastry up as tightly as possible. Chill in the fridge for 10 minutes or so.

Step 3

Take a very sharp knife and cut the roll into 12 equal slices, laying them flat on 2 non-stick baking trays as you go. Brush each pinwheel lightly with beaten egg and sprinkle over the herbs. Bake for 12-15 minutes until puffed and golden. Leave to stand for 5-10 minutes before serving.
