Class News – 21st November 2025

This week in **Little Learners** we have been very busy exploring 2D shapes. We have played a game where we took it in turns to figure out the missing shape! We also made our very own shape collage and practiced our cutting and scissor skills. We have also been engaging in Early Phonics skills, and embedding our learning with listening and attention activities. For 'My Happy Mind' this week, we made our very own 'brain hats', and we continued to learn about how amazing our brains are! We have also had lots of fun exploring colour and colour names!

This week, **Reception** children have been busy identifying and naming circles and triangles, and learning to describe their mathematical properties. They have enjoyed exploring these shapes in the environment, spotting them in everyday objects, and using them to create their own wonderful pictures. The class has shown great interest and enthusiasm throughout, confidently talking about what they have discovered and proudly sharing their creations.

Recently in history lessons, **Year 1** have enjoyed learning about Rosa Parks and significant events, including when the bus driver ordered her to give up her seat (1955) and she refused to give up her seat because of the colour of her skin. She was arrested, but her quiet firm "no" was a powerful moment of protest against segregation. The children really got involved acting this out, and sharing their opinions beautifully. One said "I agree with Rosa Parks because she tried to change the rules, she made changes for now".

In **Year 2** we have been working hard to learn and sing our nativity songs as well as starting to learn our parts. We have looked at some of the vocabulary used in the Bog Baby story and discussed why the author might have chosen these words. This led to us thinking about our word choices in our writing!

This week in **Year 3**, we have been learning about our new Geography topic, Japan, focusing on its human features and comparing them with those of the United Kingdom. In English, the children have created their own threatening monsters and have begun planning their threat narratives. The ideas they have produced are exceptional and I am very much looking forward to reading their completed work. Finally, we had our last clarinet lesson in preparation for our concert on Tuesday. We hope you are able to join us to celebrate the children's hard work, progress and developing musical skills.



In **Year 4** this week, we have been looking at the different features in our example text in English. We have identified pronouns, fronted adverbials and expanded noun phrases. In DT, we have planned our cold drinks using the questionnaires we created.

This week, within maths, **Year 5** have been looking at ordering and comparing fractions. We looked at what to do if two or more fractions have the same denominator, what to do if two or more fractions have the same numerator, and what can be done if two or more fractions have differing numerators and denominators.

This week in **Year 6** we have finished our unit on fractions and are now looking at measurement. We are finishing off our warning letters this Friday in English and write out own "introduction rap" in French.

Healthy recipe of the week!



Do you bring a lunchbox to school? Or fancy trying something new at snack time? Why not try one of these:



Lunchbox snacks

Easy

Total time: 30 mins

Keep hunger pangs at bay with these healthy, yummy lunchbox nibbles

Method

Step 1

Bean dip with veggie sticks 5 of 5-a-day, low fat. Whizz 215g can drained butterbeans, squeeze lemon juice, 1 small crushed garlic clove, 1 tbsp each chopped parsley and mint, 2 tsp olive oil and 1 tbsp water. Serve with vegetable dippers made from 1 celery stick, 1 carrot and ½ red pepper - wrap in a damp piece of kitchen paper to stop them drying out (serves 1).

Step 2

Raspberry banana smoothie Whizz 85g raspberries together with 1 chopped banana and 150ml orange juice until smooth (serves 1).

Step 3

Cinnamon custard plums Put 1 tbsp honey, 1 tsp butter, 2 quartered plums, few drops vanilla extract, pinch ground cinnamon and 2 tsp water in a dish. Cover with cling film, pierce, microwave for 3 mins on High. Once cooled, put fruit in a container and spoon 2-3 tbsp custard on top. Seal and refrigerate (serves 1).

Step 4

Apricot yogurt granola pots Mix 200g oats, 2 tbsp honey and 1 tbsp sunflower oil in a baking tray. Spread out and bake at 200C/ 180C fan/ gas 6 for 7 mins. Stir, bake for 7 mins more. Cool. Mix with 150g dried fruits (enough for 8 servings). For one serving, mix 100ml natural yogurt with 1 tbsp sugar-free apricot jam in a container. Store granola in an airtight container and portion into a small bag when packing lunchbox.

Ingredients

Step 5

Carrot & pineapple muffins Sift together 140g self-raising flour, 85g wholemeal flour (reserving about 2 tbsp of the bran), ½ tsp bicarbonate of soda, 2 tsp ground cinnamon and a pinch salt. In another bowl, beat 150ml sunflower oil with 100g golden caster sugar. Add 200g mashed cooked carrots, 3 canned pineapple slices, cut into cubes, 2 tbsp pineapple juice from the can, 1 egg and 1 tsp vanilla extract. Mix in 50g sunflower seeds. Fold dry mix into the wet one. Cut out a dozen 10cm squares of baking parchment and place in the holes of a muffin tin. Spoon mixture into tin, sprinkle with bran and a few sunflower seeds. Bake at 200C/ 180C fan/ gas 6 for 20-25 mins or until a skewer comes out clean. Leave to cool (makes 12).
